Toonies for Turbans


To pay for the material needed to make the Cancer Turbans, the Outreach Committee would appreciate your help. Please donate toonies by leaving them in the jar in the Narthex

Highlights from the November Parish Survey

Thank you to all who completed the recent parish survey. A total of 81 completed surveys were received, representing 124 members of our parish family. Highlights include:

- 68% of respondents would welcome Morning Prayer and/or Evensong as additional or alterative worship services. Frequency for these services were equally divided between monthly and bi-monthly
- a high percentage of respondents utilize our weekly bulletin as a source of information by either taking it home from Sunday services or reading it on-line
- 84% prefer announcements at the beginning of Sunday services (vs. at the end or not at all) but written comments suggest these should be short in duration

Other tools used to communicate information to our parish family received the following endorsements:

- 80% check the bulletin board postings on a regular basis
- 99% value our quarterly newsletter "The Dragon Flyer"
- 73% check their mailbox frequently
- 81% endorsed the printing of the monthly parish event calendar
- only 31% accessed our parish website as a source of information during the previous month this needs to be addressed

Information from the survey has been shared with the appropriate Laity committees for follow-up and action. Additional comments and input are always welcome.
