Our Service Announcements

Parish Executive, at its October meeting, reviewed the placement of announcements in our services. In the short term, and as a general rule, the wardens are going to continue to do announcements at the beginning of the 8:15 service and at the end of the 10:00 services. We'd appreciate if our congregation would give some thought to the timing of announcements in these services, and bring any perceptions or insights they have to Vestry.

The issue is not necessarily an either/or situation. At a recent main 11 a.m. service in the Episcopal National Cathedral in Washington, D.C. on Sept. 20th, parish announcements were made in the middle of the service by the homilist just before the sermon. At the 10 a.m. folk mass service in a chapel in the same cathedral, they were made at the end of the service by both the presiding minister and by several members of the congregation.
