### **Financial Update as of September 30, 2009**

Nov. 4, 2009

Our financial situation, coming out of September, is not particularly encouraging. Our regular givings are down substantially, both from the budget that Vestry approved last January, and from where we were last year.

In very simple terms, we are ahead of 2008 in donations for capital improvements, and in fundraising (largely due to the auction). Some of our costs are also slightly less than expected.

On the negative side, some of our expenditures are higher than anticipated, for various reasons. As of the financial report tabled at Parish Council on Oct. 27<sup>th</sup>, we have an adjusted operating deficit of approximately \$22,000. It is within our means to erase this deficit by the end of December, but this will require a commitment by all parishioners to sustain their weekly givings and to contribute – where and when they can – to erasing this deficit.

We anticipate providing a more detailed analysis of our financial situation in the bulletin in the next week or two, once we have received the updated figures for October.
