THE NEEDS OF CAMP LITTLE DRAGON

- 2 bags of salt (for craft)
- Masking tape (not dollar store as it does not stick well)
- Small jars with lids (jam jars)
- Ice cream treats (popsicles, ice cream treats on sticks) must be nut free (Chapman's or Selection)- these can go in the camp freezer in the electrical room.
- When camp starts fresh fruit is nice (watermelons, basket of peaches) if bringing in fruit please label it as camp
