A Big Thank You

Catherine Carlson and I have spoken before summer Sunday services to express our appreciation to the dozens of parishioners who supported our ice cream outreach this past very hot summer. Over 11 Friday lunches in June, July, August and September, we served 54 large tubs of ice cream to hundreds of men and women (and a few children) at St. John's Kitchen in downtown Kitchener.
