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### **SOCIAL JUSTICE**

At our last meeting of the Social Justice committee, it was suggested that we place in the bulletin a few thought provoking water facts.

- On July 28, 2010, the United Nations General Assembly adopted a historic resolution recognizing the human rights to water and sanitation as "essential for the full enjoyment of the right to life."
- At any given time, there are more than 100 drinking water advisories in First Nations throughout Canada.
- Canada's net annual virtual water exports (exports minus imports) amount to just under 60 billion cubic metres, enough to fill the Rogers Centre in Toronto 37,500 times.
- Every year, Canada uses (and destroys) 1 billion, 95 million cubic metres of fresh water in the production – mostly for export to the U.S. – of energy from the tar sands of Alberta.
- Canadians currently use an average of 329 litres of water per person, per day – second only to the United States in the developed world, and more than twice as much as Europeans.
