Financial Update – as of October 31, 2023

Revenue from Donations Jan-Oct, 2023 Actual \$204,674 Budget \$215,306 Below Budget \$10,632

As of the end of October, our donations for operations are below budget by \$10,632. At our vestry meeting in January, 2023, we approved a budget with an increase in donations of 4.3% from the prior year, and we have not seen any increase.

Unfortunately, the church operations are experiencing the same inflationary pressures as are being felt everywhere, and our costs for salaries, utilities, and other items have risen. We are fortunate to have had rental income of about \$5,000 to help offset this shortfall in donations, but some of that rental income may not recur.

Thank you to all who have responded to the increased budget, and we encourage everyone to continue to consider how they can support St. George's financially. The budget for donations for rest of the year are Nov \$20,500 and Dec \$42,375 Anne Taylor, Treasurer
