# **Waterloo Deanery Refugee Committee Financial Update**

April 18, 2024

As of the end of February, our Deanery Refugee Committee completed its full year of sponsorship of our most recent refugee family: Alganesh, Binyam, Yoursalem and Yonatan. Technically, our job is done. That said, we are continuing to provide some monthly financial support to the family – perhaps up to the end of their second year in our Region: the end of February 2025.

To date, our churches have been very generous and supportive. Since May 2022, our deanery's churches have made 51 contributions for our refugee family, totaling \$39,829.03. Our committee recognized from the outset that because of inflation we would need more funding than in the past. For example, current rent for the family's two-bedroom apartment is \$700 more per month than the rent we paid for our previous family. As well, government support has not kept up with inflation. Consequently, our committee has made a commitment to supplement the family's income, as necessary, up to the end of their second year so they do not go into debt or become impoverished and homeless. We are hopeful that in the next six months or so one (or both) parents will find part-time or full-time employment, thereby earning income that can then take the place of our own supplemental funding and make the family genuinely self-sufficient.

At our recent committee meeting on April 17th, we estimated that we may need as much as \$7000 to get the family through to Feb 28 2025. This amount would include anticipated further dental work for the parents, on-going support for the

family for ten more months, and the repayment of their airfare in coming to Canada on Feb 22, 2023. We can defer some of the airfare cost and we may only need to provide monthly supplements until September or October. Time will tell. Our best guess is that roughly \$7000 would cover all the anticipated expenses. If spread across all of our churches, this works out to \$500-\$600 per church between now and next February. I recognize, as I always have, that some churches may be able to provide additional funding; some may provide less.

Since May of 2022, our church has contributed \$5930 (in addition to four other donations since December of 2015 in support of our previous refugee families). We are <u>very</u> thankful for this support.

I have been asked to convey this information to you to both let you know where we (as a deanery) stand and to ask you to consider contributing some additional funding over the next ten months, as you are able, so we can fully integrate our family into our region.

If you have any questions, I'd be happy to do my best to answer them.
