To Philemon our dear friend and co-worker, ² to Apphia our sister, to Archippus our fellow-soldier, and to the church in your house:

¹Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus, and Timothy our brother,

³ Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

⁴When I remember you in my prayers, I always thank my God ⁵ because I hear of your love for all the saints and your faith towards the Lord Jesus. ⁶ I pray that the sharing of your faith may become effective when you perceive all the good that we may do for Christ. ⁷ I have indeed received much joy and encouragement from your love, because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed through you, my brother.

⁸ For this reason, though I am bold enough in Christ to command you to do your duty, ⁹ yet I would rather appeal to you on the basis of love—and I, Paul, do this as an old man, and now also as a prisoner of Christ Jesus. ¹⁰ I am appealing to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I have become during my imprisonment. ¹¹ Formerly he was useless to you, but now he is indeed useful both to you and to me. ¹² I am sending him, that is, my own heart, back to you. ¹³ I wanted to keep him with me, so that he might be of service to me in your place during my imprisonment for the gospel; ¹⁴ but I preferred to do nothing without your consent, in order that your good deed might be voluntary and not something forced. ¹⁵ Perhaps this is the reason he was separated from you for a while, so that you might have him back for ever, ¹⁶ no longer as a slave but as more than a slave, a beloved brother—especially to me but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord.

¹⁷ So if you consider me your partner, welcome him as you would welcome me. ¹⁸ If he has wronged you in any way, or owes you anything, charge that to my account. ¹⁹ I, Paul, am writing this with my own hand: I will repay it. I say nothing about your owing me even your own self. ²⁰ Yes, brother, let me have this benefit from you in the Lord! Refresh my heart in Christ. ²¹ Confident of your obedience, I am writing to you, knowing that you will do even more than I say. ²² One thing more—prepare a guest room for me, for I am hoping through your prayers to be restored to you.

²³ Epaphras, my fellow-prisoner in Christ Jesus, sends greetings to you, ²⁴ and so do Mark, Aristarchus, Demas, and Luke, my fellow-workers.

²⁵ The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit.

Deanery Refugee Committee Update Aug 26, 2025

I have been a bit remiss in providing an update. Our deanery committee met last on May 28th. We are hoping to meet again in the second or third week of September and perhaps select a new family from overseas.

New rules introduced by the government and the Diocese stipulate that we now need to have at least \$18,100 in our deanery refugee account before we can select a new family. This amount itself will not come close to paying all of the expenses incurred during the first year the new family is in Canada, but the amount is an indication that our twelve churches can afford to initiate this sponsorship – over 7th since 2016.

As of today, we have \$13,650 in our deanery account. The Diocese is prepared to top up our funding to the necessary \$18,100, as long as the additional funds go into a bank account set up for the new family themselves. We are still working out the details.

To put this in context, our church has been incredibly generous in supporting our previous sponsored families. Since June 2022, for example, our parishioners have contributed over \$16,000 to help pay for the costs incurred by our last family, including the roughly \$6500 needed to pay for the cost of their airfare to Toronto. The response for contributions has been outstanding! I am hoping our parish will be able to continue to support the collective efforts of our twelve local churches to help a refugee family relocate and integrate into our region and our country. I'll provide a further update after the next committee meeting.
