As to the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our being gathered together to him, we beg you, brothers and sisters, ² not to be quickly shaken in mind or alarmed, either by spirit or by word or by letter, as though from us, to the effect that the day of the Lord is already here. ³ Let no one deceive you in any way; for that day will not come unless the rebellion comes first and the lawless one is revealed, the one destined for destruction. ⁴ He opposes and exalts himself above every so-called god or object of worship, so that he takes his seat in the temple of God, declaring himself to be God. ⁵ Do you not remember that I told you these things when I was still with you?

¹³ But we must always give thanks to God for you, brothers and sisters beloved by the Lord, because God chose you as the first fruits for salvation through sanctification by the Spirit and through belief in the truth. ¹⁴ For this purpose he called you through our proclamation of the good news, so that you may obtain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. ¹⁵ So then, brothers and sisters, stand firm and hold fast to the traditions that you were taught by us, either by word of mouth or by our letter.

they cannot die any more, because they are like angels and are children of God, being children of the resurrection. ³⁷ And the fact that the dead are raised Moses himself showed, in the story about the bush, where he speaks of the Lord as the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. ³⁸ Now he is God not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all of them are alive.'





ACCESSIBILITY FUNDRAISING UPDATE

Over the last 18 months, fundraising (\$100,000 goal) has occurred within our Parish to accomplish the following:

- * 2024: widening our main driveway; installation of a new driveway; installation of new concrete curbing; removal and installation of a new front garden-sidewalk boundary wall (\$35,000)
- * 2025: removal and installation of new entrance doors and automatic door openers at the Main Entrance door and the rear of Thompson Hall in the basement; installation of automatic door openers on the inner set of doors near the Main Entrance and near the rear of Thompson Hall. (\$45,000)
- * 2026: We are planning for more concrete threshold work to the same outside doors as well as a refurbishment of the concrete stairs at the rear of the building next Spring.

With your help we have fully paid for the above 2024 and 2025 work and have about \$10,000 remaining in the Accessibility Project Fund within Capital Repairs for 2026. **Thanks so much for your assistance in this fundraiser as it continues.** The work accomplished in 2024 and now in 2025 is quite impressive!

Deanery Refugee Committee Update

We met as a committee on Nov 19th. We are close to choosing a new family of four – likely within the next month or so. When we have secured a necessary apartment, we will put out a call for furniture, housewares, bedding, etc. One of our churches recently came forward with a contribution of \$5000 (!!) – terrific news. We ourselves here at St. George's are presently in a position to contribute \$800 to the committee's fund, accumulated over a number of months. Our committee will shortly have \$19,850. With expected additional Diocesan funds, we will then have approximately \$26,350, which will go a long way to funding the family. My estimate is that we will need roughly \$35,000 to get through a full year, perhaps more, as rent is likely to be roughly \$2100 per month.

To that end, I have put a one-page flyer in the narthex that outlines a *Wine Survivor* series of draws being sponsored by St. James (Cambridge) as a fund raiser for our refugee committee and St. James's church expenses. If you enjoy wine, you may very well enjoy entering the draw; the deadline is Nov. 16th. If you can't drop off a bottle at St. James during their office hours (9 am to 1 pm), you can provide \$15 for a bottle (that they will select) and a \$10 entry fee – via e-transfer: donations@stjamesang.ca.
