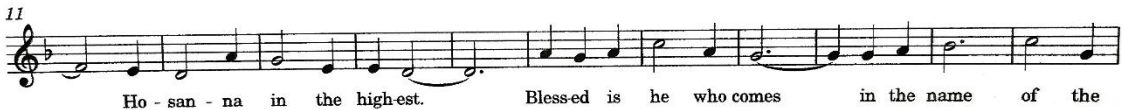

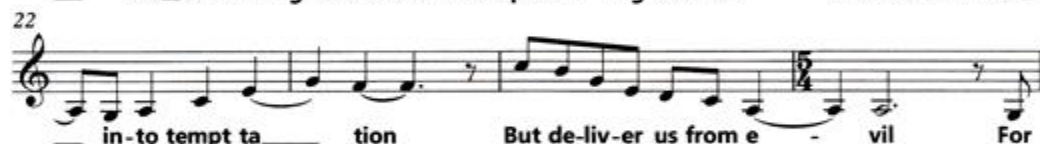
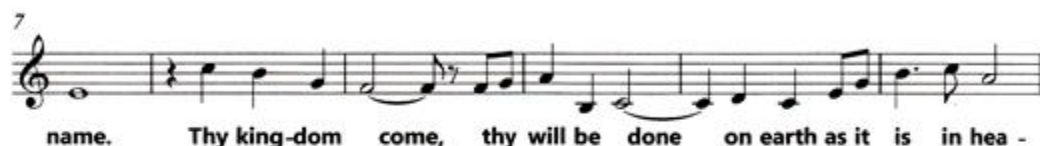

## **Deanery Refugee Update**

Our committee met (half in person at our church, half on ZOOM) on Tuesday evening, Nov. 25<sup>th</sup>.

Some good news. Three churches (including our own) have contributed \$6800 since mid-October. We now have \$20,850 in our Deanery Refugee account! If we add in the anticipated contribution from the Diocese, we should have at least \$27,000 to begin our sponsorship of a new family.

We have not yet chosen a new family, as no families of four have cropped up on the recent lists that the Diocese has received and provided to us. Consequently, we think we will likely defer our selection to the new year. All of the cutbacks that the federal and Ontario governments have made to immigration quotas has impacted our own possibilities.

Looking ahead, to fully sponsor a new family of four we probably need roughly \$1000 in 2026 from each of the eight local churches who are actively participating in our refugee outreach. Seems like a fair bit to raise, but if 10 parishioners at each church give \$2 a week toward our refugees for 50 weeks, we get to \$1000 from each church!

Many thanks for your continued support of this outreach.
