## **Refugee Family Update**

Our refugee family (mom plus 3 boys) has not yet arrived. We have determined that the government's immigration slowdown in December delayed Mapenzi's departure, which in turn put her medical clearance out-of-date. We are doing what we can to rectify and update the overseas paperwork, but this process is challenging and difficult as we do not have an immediate connection with the key officials in Tanzania. The small bit of good news is that we can extend the 2-bedroom apartment lease month-by-month as we need to, as long as we continue to pay the rent (\$1899 per month). We continue to appreciate your continued support of this faithful initiative.

## **Selection Committee Update – April 30, 2026**

We have completed the interview process and have selected a candidate whose name has just been forwarded to our Bishop, The Right Reverend Dr. Todd Townshend. Of particular note is the fact that it is the Bishop who offers the position to our choice of candidate – not us.

By canon law, the normal notice period from acceptance of the position to start-up is 3 months to allow for the determination of many details such as contract negotiations, end date at current placement, start date at St. George's, the Rectory, adequate time to move to St. George's (we pay the moving expenses), holidays yet to occur (the current placement supports the vacation pay), etc.

As you are aware, the eight members of your Selection Committee cannot divulge any details of the number of candidates, who they are, where they are currently, the interview questions and results, the reasons for our decisions, etc. Only very specific announcements through the Chair, Nelson Cuthbert, or Vice-Chair, Ray Finnie, are permitted to insure a common message to all. There are a number of solid reasons for this stance. For example, if any details of our discussions got back to the current placements of the candidates, it would create very difficult situations both now and in the future.

Thanks so much for your continued prayers and support. It has been a long and detailed process since the end of last September when the Selection Committee was formed and the work began. Hopefully, all will proceed well, and we will have a happy announcement for you soon!

**St. George's of Forest Hill Anglican Church  
Fundraiser  
Accessibility Project – Phase 3 of 3**

In 2024, your Property and Maintenance Committee presented a three-year project to Vestry to improve three primary areas of accessibility which required attention. Almost two-thirds of this Project has been completed throughout 2024 and 2025 – we are almost there! Here is a summary of the details to complete the entire project:

**1.) Accessibility Upgrades to the Church Entrances: TO BE DONE**

Front Entrance & Lower Thompson Hall Rear Entrance: Removal of old concrete sidewalk apron at threshold of outside doors and install new, graded concrete aprons.

**2.) Reconfiguration and Repaving of the Entrance Driveway: DONE**

**3.) Rear Stairs and Railings: TO BE DONE**

Repair the existing concrete stairs at the rear entrance to the church and either repair and recoat the existing railings or install new aluminum railings.

**The following Motion was passed at Parish Council on Tues. Apr. 28, 2026:** Be it resolved that we proceed with the remainder of this project as detailed in the above proposal which includes allocating partial monies from the Capital Repairs' Fund and the Dorcas Folds' Fund AND that we undertake an immediate \$16,000 fundraising campaign for the remainder of the funds required.

**Fundraising Campaign (\$16,000):** We began this campaign on Sun. May 3. Several local concrete contractors have been contacted to give us quotes.
